

Hujiang College

Established in June 2017, Hujiang College is a teaching institution for USST students' cultural quality, music literacy education and teaching and research of Chinese as a foreign language. It is also responsible for the daily affairs management of foreign students in USST, the establishment and affairs of overseas Confucius Institutes and administration coordination work. The main tasks of the college are: to undertake the general education courses of Chinese language and music in USST, the rehearsals and performances of the student art groups, lead the campus culture construction; be responsible for the Chinese language teaching and related daily affairs for the international students, international exchange students and international students of various programs, the establishment of Confucius institute, the dissemination of Chinese excellent culture, and efforts to promote the development of the education of international students.

The college now has three departments, including the Music Department, the Cultural Quality Teaching and Research Department, and the Teaching and Research Department for Teaching Chinese as a Foreign Language. It serves the mission of inheriting the culture of Hujiang University for a hundred years and promoting the humanistic spirit of the University. There are 25 faculty members, including 17 full-time teachers. Through cultural and artistic classrooms and artistic practice, it comprehensively enhances the humanities and music and music literacy of college students, and integrates culture and art into the study and life of USST students, promotes them to become outstanding talents in both arts and sciences and have balanced development.

The College has 428 international students, mostly in the Business School, School of Optical-Electrical and Computer Engineering, School of Medical Instrument and Food Engineering. International students come from more than 50 countries and regions on 5 continents. The top 5 countries are: Sweden, Kazakhstan, Mongolia, Kenya, Kyrgyzstan. In 2017, there were 106 new students, including 86 undergraduates and 16 masters.
